## Renaming of Bellulia Wang, Zhou & Zhou, 2016

Mr Nick Gardner (Potomac State College of West Virginia University) has informed us that the name *Bellulia* which we used to describe a new genus of basal ornithuromorph bird from the Early Cretaceous (Wang, Zhou & Zhou, 2016) is preoccupied by a species of moth. This was described by Fibiger (2008) as a genus of moths of the Erebidae family, and the type species is *Bellulia parabella*. We therefore propose to substitute the name *Bellulornis* nom. nov. for the new ornithuromorph bird, the type species of which is *Bellulornis rectusunguis* (Wang *et al.*, 2016).
